Aluminum (disposable)	No, unless used more than once	NO	NO	Cannot be Kasherred. New ones should be first washed with warm soapy water.
Aluminum (not disposable)	YES, see note	See note	See note	- If used with liquid, kasher via <i>hagala</i> - If used without liquids, cannot be Kasherred. -For <i>Tevillah</i> , consult your Rabbi if a <i>Bracha</i> is required.
Baking sheet	YES	NO	SEE NOTE	Consult your Rabbi
Blech	NO	NO	NO	CONSULT YOUR RABBI
Bone China	YES without a <i>Bracha</i>	NO	NO	
Braces	NO	NO	Not Required	Clean braces thoroughly paying special attention to hooks on braces. Some don't eat hot <i>Chametz</i> for 24 hours prior to the last permitted time for eating <i>Chametz</i>
Candlesticks & Candlesticks Tray	NO	See Note	NO	Clean thoroughly and don't wash in a sink which is <i>Kosher</i> for <i>Pesach</i> .
Cast Iron	YES	YES	YES	- If used with liquid, kasher via <i>hagala</i> - If used without liquids, requires <i>libun gamur</i> .
Ceramic (e.g. coffee mug)	YES without <i>Bracha</i>	NO	NO	
China	YES without a <i>Bracha</i>	NO	NO	
Coffee maker	See note	See note	See note	There are many different types, therefore consult your Rabbi
Colander (metal)	YES	NO	NO

Corningware	See note	NO	NO	CONSULT YOUR RABBI - If manufactured before 1995, requires <i>tevillah</i> with a <i>Bracha</i> (as it is glass) - If manufactured after 1995, requires <i>tevillah</i> without a <i>Bracha</i> (as it is glazed ceramic).
Crystal	YES	NO	See note	RINSE IN COLD WATER & SOAP If used cold ask your Rabbi
Dentures (false teeth)	NO	YES	Not required	For <i>Pesach</i> , kasher via <i>irui kli rishon</i> after waiting 24 hrs from eating hot <i>Chametz</i> .
Dishwasher made of Porcelain	NO	NO	NO	
Dishwasher made of Stainless steel or plastic	NO	NO	See note	Consult your Rabbi.
Duralex	YES	NO	YES	If used cold ask Rabbinic question.
Food Processor	YES, for the metal portions	NO	YES	For year-round, kasher all parts including those made of hard plastic via <i>hagala</i> .
Frying pan, with Teflon coating	YES without a <i>Bracha</i>	NO	See note	Consult your Rabbi

Frying pan, with Teflon	YES without a Bracha	NO	See note	Consult your Rabbi
Teflon coating		note		grease, <i>kasher</i> via <i>hagala</i> - If used with insignificant amounts of oil (e.g. cooking spray) <i>Consult your Rabbi</i> .
Glass-topped range	NO	NO	NO	
Glasses used for drinking	YES	See note	See Note	RINSE IN COLD WATER If used with hot beverages or washed in a dishwasher, they cannot be Kasherred for Pesach. All year round, these can be Kasherred with Hagala. Otherwise, fill the glasses with water and leave the water in the glasses for at least 24 hours. Repeat this procedure two additional times with fresh water.
Highchairs-baby	NO	YES See note	YES	Spotlessly clean and do not use for 24 hours. Boiling water to be poured over the entire surface, then rinse with cold water and cover with contact paper over Pesach.
Hot Plate	NO	See Note	See Note	To <i>kasher</i> , clean and do not use for 24 hours, then leave on highest setting for half an hour, then cover with 2 layers of heavy duty aluminum foil.
Ice Trays	NO	NO	NO	
Mixer & Blender	YES, metal or glass parts	NO See Note	Consult your Rabbi	For Pesach, purchase new blades and bowls. Clean base of machine thoroughly including nooks, crannies and crevices.
Microwave oven	YES, only glass plate	See Note	See Note	Consult your Rabbi
Pot made of Metal	YES	YES	YES	Hagala
Pot made of Teflon-coated metal	YES without a Bracha	NO	See note	Consult your Rabbi
Plastic	NO	See note	See note	Consult your Rabbi
Pyrex	YES	NO	See note	Consult your Rabbi
Rubber	NO	See note	YES	<i>Hagala</i> , assuming there are no cracks where food might get trapped. If there are cracks, it cannot be <i>kasherred</i> (or used). For Pesach, consult your Rabbi
Stainless steel	YES	YES	YES	For <i>Kasherred</i> , see individual utensils (e.g. baking sheet, frying pan, pot).
Stoneware	YES without a Bracha	NO	NO	
Urns & Kettles	YES	NO	YES, see note	Consult your Rabbi
Wood	NO	YES	YES	<i>Hagala</i> assuming there are no cracks where the food might get trapped. If there are cracks, it cannot be Kasherred (or used).
